September Horticulture Hero



August and Ruth Aimone are a volunteer partnership that we all agree are key to the success of our Brazoria County Master Gardener organization. They are experienced, skilled educators and we have all benefited from their formal classes and "on the job" teachings on vegetable gardening, propagation and proper greenhouse procedures.

Before retiring, the Aimones were school teachers who both taught math to several generations of Pearland students. They won't confirm or deny, but we believe they are also retired Hogwarts professors with magical green thumbs.

You first meet these wizards in your intern class where they teach you how to successfully grow vegetables and the art of plant propagation. Their classes combine Ruth's engaging, interactive lectures with hands-on practice and always include a bit of comedy from August as he keeps Ruth on script and sprinkles in a few good puns. We all still remember what we learned in those classes and the Aimone's always receive high marks from the interns. As talented as they are in engaging adults in horticulture lessons, their true talent lies in maintaining their calm and keeping elementary and middle school Junior Master Gardeners engaged in learning about plants and gardening.

The Aimone's talents don't end with their teaching experience. That's just the beginning. They work their magic in the BEES greenhouse. In the dead of winter when the BEES demonstration gardens are cold and brown, the Aimone's begin to transform the old BEES greenhouse into a world of healthy green vegetable seedlings. They start with planting hundreds and hundreds of tomato and pepper seeds on the warming tables and then lead a team of volunteers in caring for them as they grow into healthy green

seedlings that later turn into greenbacks at our annual veggie seedling sale. Working in the greenhouse with Ruth and August is a transformative experience for the volunteer as well as the seedlings. Every BEES greenhouse volunteer levels up their propagation skills working side-by-side with Ruth and August.

Want to learn which variety of a vegetable does best in Brazoria County? Ask the Aimones. Not enough room in your garden bed for the vegetables you want to plant? The Aimones will teach you how to create a successful container garden out of 5 gallon buckets, empty water bottles and some good soil. Want to increase your success rate in raising seedlings? Ask the Aimones to share their magical plant medium recipe and Hasta-Grow potions with you. Want to know what seeds to buy and where to buy them? Say it with me, "Ask the Aimones".

So much more can be said about the magical Aimones. Besides always being ready to teach when asked along with caring for the BEES greenhouse, they have also given many hours to the BCMGA Board in a variety of capacities including Greenhouse Leader (Ruth) and Board Secretary (August). We know every BCMG member and intern has their own favorite Aimone story or pun to share.
