The Master Gardens are an ongoing project of the Cypress Basin Master Gardeners who plant and maintain the gardens as a horticultural demonstration and educational effort for the community and visitors.

Earth-Kind - Earth-Kind landscaping techniques combine the best of organic and traditional gardening. Creating a research-based horticultural system promoting water conservation, reduced fertilizer & pesticide use. <a href="www.earthkind.tamu.edu">www.earthkind.tamu.edu</a> We feature Earth-Kind Roses throughout the gardens.

Flowering Bulbs - A new addition for 2016 features a variety of bulbs with the goal of a "Bulb Blooming Every Month".

**Hoop House** - A demonstration project featuring raised beds from a variety of materials, drip irrigation and plant propagation.

Native Plants - A variety of Texas native plants that thrive, come rain or shine, with little to no pesticides or fertilizers and less water.

Rain Water Harvesting - Promoting water conservation, this 1200 gallon system collects rain water from only 1/8 of the building roof area. Water is used for drip irrigation in the perennial beds.

Texas Superstars - Every plant earning this designation undergoes several years of extensive field trials by Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Service. They must be shown to be superior performing plants under Texas growing conditions. www.texassuperstar.com

Woodland Trail - An on-going project in a natural setting showcasing native plants and trees in a forest environment.


