Highlights from the 8/13/16 Texas Master Gardener Board of Directors Meeting at Texas A&M in College Station.

The Gardens at Texas A&M continue to receive donations from Master Gardeners for the Earth Kind Gardens that is to be one of 26 gardens located within the Teaching Gardens. To date the 6000 Master Gardeners in Texas have donated \$136,000. Dr. Doug Welsh gave an update on the construction progress. Groundbreaking took place on June 17th for Phase I of the Gardens which includes the Teaching Gardens, White Creek Restoration, the Event Lawn and the Pavilion. Dr. Welsh is retiring at the end of 2016. Joseph Johnson a 1988 graduate of Texas A&M is taking over the Gardens project.
