Getting to Know Your Master Gardener Library



Recently I visited our Master Gardener Library and found a wealth of information along its shelves. The Library is open Mondays from 9 am to noon. Master Gardeners and Interns are on hand to help find reference material and answer gardening questions. Books are available for Master Gardeners to check out and open to the public for browsing.

The books in the library are organized under these topics: General Gardening (167 books), Animals (13), Organic Gardening (16), House Plants (27), Herbs (20), Propagation (5), Soils and Compost (26), Botany and Plant Taxonomy (19), Mushrooms (5), Landscaping (22), Roses (10), Weeds, Insects, and Diseases (23), Cacti & Succulents (7), Shrubs & Trees (9), Grasses and Lawns (26), Water Gardening & Water Harvesting (7), Field Guides (19), Texas Gardening (89), Children's Books (8), and Pruning (5). I was told that the books on Texas gardening are the most popular.

Consideration is being given to expanding the Library hours so that more of us can take advantage of its services. We'll keep you advised.

Stop by and view the information available in our Master Gardener Library. If you want to donate gardening books, the Library is a good destination for them.





To Populate, We Pollinate

Pollinators – creatures that transfer pollen from plant to plant - are essential to plant reproduction, and our own. They are responsible for the survival and continuity of over 80% of the world's flowering plants. Our survival depends on pollinators' health; without them, most humans and animals would starve.

From 1963 until 1998, Don Tuff (PhD Entomology, Texas A&M) served as a professor of biology at Texas State University, teaching introductory botany and zoology; upper level classes in entomology, parasitology, comparative anatomy; and graduate classes in medical entomology, parasites of wildlife, and wildlife diseases. Don has now turned his attention to our native bees, the flowers they pollinate, and the threats to their survival.
