

During the April 15th Greenhouse Committee Meeting, the profitability of the spring vegetable and perennial sales was discussed. The vegetable sale yielded a profit of \$2,789.00 and the perennial sale yielded \$4,003.00. It is safe to say the two sales were very successful. The advertising bills are still outstanding, which will minimally alter the final profit figures.

Our fall sale will be a combined vegetable, herb, rose and perennial sale and will be held on Saturday, September 26th. We also discussed the possibility of having a limited number of small trees included in the This decision will be made after a review of vendor availability and pricing. When the order list and vendors are finalized, we plan to have preorder sheets available for Master Gardeners. The preorders will also be prepaid. This will allow everyone to get the plants they want and us to still offer a wide selection to the public. The fall seminars were discussed. We would like to include a wildflower seminar in the fall sale seminar schedule. If anyone would like to develop this seminar, please contact Karla Tomaka or Don Wyatt. If we can develop a wildflower seminar, wildflower seed balls could possibly be sold at the fall sale. perennial selection group for the fall sale will meet Wednesday, May 6th, at 9:00AM in the classroom.

The Killeen Municipal Garden project was discussed. This is a flagship project for the BCMGA in conjunction with the City of Killeen Court System. Master Gardeners volunteer their time in constructing beds and supervising juveniles in planting and harvesting vegetables. According to the Memorandum of Understanding between the BCMGA and the Killeen Courts, BCMGA volunteers are to be reimbursed for purchases made to support the Killeen Municipal Garden unless the BCMGA makes a specific donation.

The next Greenhouse Committee meeting will be Wednesday, May 13th at 9:00 in the classroom. All Master Gardeners are welcome to attend. There will be a signup sheet for the Greenhouse Committee and other committees within the BCMGA at the Class of 2009 graduation ceremony May 20th.
