
We were advised at the board meeting this morning about a

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING !!!

During the past year, 2 desert gardens have been planned and installed in Master Gardener Outreach projects. The theme is water conservation utilizing xeric plants with water-wise native plants. Both have been designed by Ursula Nanna and implemented expertly by Bell County



Master Gardeners. Both gardens are also vastly different in style and design demonstrating that xeric desert gardens can be very appealing and aren't just a cactus and some stone. They can actually be very lush.

The first garden is located at the Killeen Municipal Court Garden. The whole crew designed the border layout and there was a class on how to install metal edging, as many had not yet used that medium. Ursula designed the plant placement, the garden layout, and with the help and direction of the Master Gardeners, the Community Court youth filled the bed with soil, bermed it, and installed the plants where they were previously placed for them. They finished with cedar mulch and a thorough watering. That Desert Garden requires water 2 times a month in summer and only as needed in



the spring and fall, usually once every month, and rarely in the winter.

The second garden is a Desert garden with a variety of very tastefully chosen pots laid out above ground. The goal in this garden is also water conservation as far as the plant material is carefully chosen. The pots are filled with river rock to make sure they stay in place. Then the Xeriscape soil formula was used to fill the pots and the plants were then placed and the pots topped off with the remainder of Xeric soil. Everything was thoroughly watered and will need watering only 1 time per month and much less

during the winter. This garden was designed by Ursula when she was **Grounds Committee** chairperson, and is now under the supervision of Pat Maskunas and her Grounds Committee. Pat, Ursula, and Karla Tomaka purchased the pots and the plants and implemented plant placement. Our very own Johnny Buck has done another wonderful layout of the lime stone. highlighting the Desert Gardens beautifully.

Please visit both locations and see how wonderful the Desert gardens are. Ursula and Succulent bug, primarily because of Fran Idoux's gardens and Ursula now has 5 Desert gardens on her property. Future articles will follow.
