She graduated as valedictorian of her high school class in 1974 and received a BS degree from Tennessee state University in Mechanical Engineering in 1979. She didn't let the fact that she was one of only two females graduating from the university stop her from achieving her dreams. She worked as an engineer until 1987. Her next adventure was to marry Ray Price and raise two beautiful daughters. She also dedicated 33 years to teaching for Port Arthur ISD. She was a beloved teacher and soccer coach at Memorial High School where she was the head of the math and science departments. In addition to her teaching job, she was also a charter member of the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc Zeta Beta Chapter of Port Arthur, TX, and a merit badge counselor and assistant scoutmaster at her local council of Boy Scouts of America. One of her most beloved activities was attending her church.

Hortense became a Jefferson County Master Gardener in 2006. She was a friend to everyone and worked as much as she could to advance the service of the JCMGs. She will missed by all who knew her.
