<b>Bare-root Trees</b>	
<b>Apple 'Anna'</b>	Bred in Israel. Popular variety for warm climates. Sweet, crisp and flavorful.
<b>Apple 'Dorsett Golden'</b>	One of few apple varieties suitable for hot climates. Early variety with medium sized fruit and sweet flavor.
<b>Asian Pear 'Tenno'sui'</b>	Cross between Hosui Asian Pear and Tennessee European Pear. Yellow fruit with slight red blush
<b>Jujube 'Li'</b>	Also called "Chinese date." Fruit is yellow-green, large and round. Loves the summer heat. Fruit ripens mid August.
<b>Jujube 'Sugar Cane'</b>	Pingpong ball sized fruit. Very sweet with crunchy flesh. Dark red brown color when ripe.
<b>Mulberry, Pakistan Fruiting</b>	Fruit up to 2-3" long. Medium size tree but can reach up to 70 ft. Grows well in moist soils.
<b>Nectarplum 'Spice Zee'</b>	Self-fruitful and very productive. Hybrid cross between a Plum and a Nectarine. One can detect both Plum and Nectarine traits in the fruit.
<b>Nectarine 'Snow Queen'</b>	Clingstone fruit. Early to mid-june. Extremely high-quality. Delicious flavor. Does well in mild winter climates
<b>Nectarine 'Atomic Red'</b>	Fruiting and Flowering nectarine. Exquisite red double flower. Fruit is medium to large and simply delicious.
<b>Peach 'August Pride'</b>	Yellow freestone with rich sweet flavor. Great for canning as well as eating. Self-fruitful with low chilling requirements, about 200 hours
<b>Peach 'Mid-Pride'</b>	Good tree vigor with good quality fruit. Yellow-orange fruit with distinctive red striping. Freestone.
<b>Peach 'Red Baron'</b>	Beautiful pinkish-red, semidouble flowers, and high quality fruit. Self-fruitful. Semi-freestone.
<b>Peach 'Tex King'</b>	Texas A&M introduction. Large, firm yellow flesh clingstone peach. Ripens May to June.
<b>Peach 'Tex Star'</b>	Semi-freestone variety. Medium sized fruit with yellow, red blushed skin. Great for canning, baking and eating fresh.
<b>Peach 'Tropic Snow'</b>	One of the best home orchard peaches for mild winter climates. Large white flesh, superb flavor. Freestone.
<b>Peach miniature 'Bonanza'</b>	High head. Popular yellow freestone, 5-6 ft tree. Large fruit is sweet and low in acid. Low chilling requirements, Self-fruitful
<b>Pear 'Kieffer'</b>	Self fruitful. Large yellow fruit good for canning. Stores well.
<b>Pear 'Southern King'</b>	A high quality pear popular in Houston. Good for fresh eating or canning. Cross between Hosui Asian and Tennessee European.
<b>Persimmon 'Fuyu (Jiro)'</b>	Apple persimmon. Medium size, flat shape, still hard when ripe, non-astringent.
<b>Persimmon 'Fuyu Giant'</b>	Larger, not as flat as Jiro. Crunchy when ripe. Sweet, flavorful, non-astringent.
<b>Plum 'Catalina'</b>	Black plum that stays firm when fully ripe. Better fruit set when planted with a pollinizer like Santa Rosa.
<b>Plum 'Mariposa'</b>	Low chill requirement. Greenish bronze, with burgundy red flesh, small pit, nearly freestone.
<b>Plum 'Methley'</b>	Self-fertile. Small, reddish purple fruit. Burgundy flesh color. Excellent quality.
<b>Plum 'Santa Rosa'</b>	Fairly self-fertile and good polinator for other plum trees. Ripens in June. Purplish red fruit.

<b>Bare-root Grapes and Berries</b>	
<b>Blackberry 'Arapaho'</b>	Thornless. Medium sized, firm, high quality fruit
<b>Blackberry 'Kiowa'</b>	Large fruited, thorny cultivar from The University of Arkansas. Top performer for Texas conditions
<b>Blackberry 'Natchez'</b>	Thornless. Large great tasting berries. Good production and growth with low chilling requirements
<b>Blackberry 'Ouachita'</b>	Thornless. Fruit size similar to Arapaho. Heavy yields and firm berries.
<b>Grape, Muscadine 'Darlene'</b>	Female variety with pinkish/bronze large berries.
<b>Grape, Muscadine 'Fry Seedless'</b>	Female variety. Popular for its large berry size and good flavor. Mid season.
<b>Grape, Muscadine 'Granny Val'</b>	Self fertile. Bronze color berries. Late maturing pollinator.
<b>Grape, Muscadine 'Ison'</b>	Self fertile. Berry color black and very large. Excellent productivity.
<b>Grape, Muscadine 'Late Fry'</b>	Self fertile. Bronze color berries. High sugar content and good vine vigor.
<b>Grape, Table 'Victoria Red'</b>	University of Arkansas/Texas A&M/Tarkington Vineyard. Disease resistant, vigor and high productivity in coastal TX
<b>Potted Fruit Trees and Shrubs</b>	
<b>Avocados:</b>	
<b>Avocado 'Joey'</b>	Cold hardy Mexican variety. Skin is purple-black and egg-shaped fruit has excellent flavor. Heavy producer.
<b>Avocado 'Mexicola Grande'</b>	Has glossy, near black, thin, easy to peel skin. Tree is fast growing and very cold tolerant.
<b>Banana 'Ice Cream'</b>	Grows to 15 -20 ft tall and is cold tolerant with fruit that tastes like vanilla ice cream.
<b>Blueberries:</b>	
<b>Blueberry 'Emerald'</b>	Southern Highbush. Mild sweet flavor, abundant crop. Low chill hours.
<b>Blueberry 'Gulf Coast'</b>	Southern Highbush. Ripens early, producing medium-sized berries. Great quality.
<b>Blueberry 'Powder Blue'</b>	Rabbiteye. Excellent for hot humid climates. Large berries are light blue with a soft dusting
<b>Blueberry 'Premier'</b>	Rabbiteye. A superb tasting fruit with a little less production. Ripens early to mid season.
<b>Blueberry 'Southern Belle'</b>	Southern Highbush. High quality berries early in the season. Low chill hours.
<b>Blueberry 'Windsor'</b>	Southern Highbush. Produces a large crop and semi spreading growth habit.
<b>Chestnut Trees:</b>	
<b>Chestnut 'Dunstan Hybrid'</b>	Resistant to chestnut blight. Dunstan Chestnut have excellent survival rates and nut production.
<b>Citrus:</b>	
<b>Grapefruit 'Rio Red'</b>	Introduced in Texas. Fruit has excellent red color, with few or no seeds. Loves long hot summers.
<b>Kumquat 'Mewia'</b>	Fruit is large, round, very sweet. Eat skin and all. Tree is a heavy bearer and very ornamental. Grows to 8 ft tall.
<b>Lemon 'Meyer Improved'</b>	Small tree with continuous crops from August - January. Grows to about 10ft tall.
<b>Lime - Mexican Thornless</b>	Also known as the bartender's lime. Mature fruit is small green, to yellow green, ripening July-December. Great in containers.

<b>Mandarin 'Kishu'</b>	Good for container growing. Fruit is small but very sweet, juicy and seedless. Matures early.
<b>Orange 'Republic of Texas'</b>	Very cold tolerant. A sweet flavorful orange. Documented back to 1847 near Angleton, TX.
<b>Orange 'Cara Cara'</b>	Believed to have developed as a cross between the Washington navel and the Brazilian Bahia navel orange. Very sweet
<b>Satsuma 'Owari'</b>	Very good flavor. Great production. Hardly any seeds. Slow growing but very productive.
<b>Figs:</b>	
<b>Fig 'Celeste'</b>	Great fruit tree for our area. Pest and disease resistant. Vigorous tree. Closed Eye. Produces on last year's wood.
<b>Fig 'Chicago Hardy'</b>	Attractive tree that produces wonderful light purple-brown skinned fruit with pink flesh.
<b>Fig 'Texas Everbearing'</b>	Large brownish purple fig with pink flesh. Small tree usually produces two crops per year.
<b>Kiwi 'Issai'</b>	Self-fertile. Smooth skinned green fruit are delicious and rich in vitamin C. Bears small smooth fruit in summer. Grow up a trellis.
<b>Olive 'Arbequina'</b>	Fast growing olive tree produces delicious fruit and oil. Will grow 15-20 ft tall. Self fertile and a good pollinator.
<b>Pecans:</b>	
<b>Pecan 'Desirable'</b>	Type I. Heavy pecan producer of round, well shaped fruit. Harvest date mid October.
<b>Pecan 'Elliott'</b>	Type II. Considered one of the most disease-resistant varieties. Small, prolific nut of excellent quality. Scab resistant.
<b>Pecan 'Oconee'</b>	Type I. Produces large nuts of outstanding quality and flavor. Adequate disease resistant. Early pollen release.
<b>Pecan 'Pawnee'</b>	Type I. Early maturing variety. Large nut and high kernel percentage. Scab resistant. Early pollen release
<b>Pecan 'Sumner'</b>	Type II. Early bearing, large, good quality. Suited for close space planting. Female flowers pollen released late.
<b>Natives Trees, Onions, Strawberries and Bluebonnets</b>	
<b>Mayhaw</b>	Known for making the world's best jelly. Typically native to swamps but can grow in well drained soils.
<b>Mexican Plum</b>	Beautiful, single trunked, spring flowering small tree. Grows to 25 ft tall.
<b>PawPaw</b>	Host to the zebra swallowtail butterfly. Small tree up to 25 ft. Protect from direct sunlight first 2 years.
<b>Onion set '1015Y'</b>	Texas famous onion. Very sweet and called 1015 in honor of the October 15 planting date for the seed. Sets are ready to plant
<b>Onion set 'Southern Belle Red'</b>	Red globe and sweet. Very healthy due to high concentration of quercetins (anti-oxidant compound).
<b>Onion set 'Texas Early White'</b>	Great flavor and easy to grow. Disease resistant. Harvest 105 days from transplants.
<b>Strawberry 'Camarosa'</b>	Early short day cultivar. Produces large fruit throughout the season. It is self pollinating and grows best in mild winter areas.
<b>Bluebonnets</b>	State flower of Texas. Full sun. Likes well drained soils that are alkaline.
