



# A Contribution from Gloria VanZante

I have a very small garden patch in my backyard. My space is limited because I have a wrap around driveway to my garage. In the afternoon my backyard faces southwest, so from 11:00 a.m. until about 3:00 p.m. my little garden patch is under full, hot sun.

As the little patch was beginning to suffer, I began to research shade structures.
