GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATION IN LTG PROGRAM

Guidelines for Participation – School Responsibilities

The school will appoint an **Adult Sponsor** (coach, teacher, parent, PTA member) to be the contact and to be accountable for the LTG garden bed(s) each semester. The duties of the **Adult Sponsor** are as follows.

- 1. **Adult Sponsor** will remain with students at all times while working in the school garden.
- 2. **Adult Sponsor** will ensure students prepare garden bed for planting prior to supplies being delivered. (Spring garden in February. Fall garden in September after Labor Day).
- **3.** If needed, the **Adult Sponsor** will help students plant garden with the guidance of an NMG Mentor. **Make arrangements prior to planting day with mentor.**
- 4. **Adult Sponsor** will send monthly progress report to mentor or LTG Chair.
- 5. **Adult Sponsor** will help students be responsible for nurturing garden plants. This includes:
- a. **Watering**: Raised beds dry out fast and need close attention during the first 4 weeks after planting. Keep the soil moist, but not soaking wet.
- b. **Controlling insects**: Use Integrated Pest Management (IPM) methods. NMG will provide you with printed and online resources to help identify insects and diseases and how to handle problems without using chemicals.
- c. **Weeding**: Hand-pull or dig out weeds frequently. NMG will provide materials to help ID weeds.
- d. **Fertilizing**: Sprinkle and dig in the LTG provided bag of organic fertilizer per bed in the garden at the beginning of each growing season.
- e. **Harvesting**: ensure students harvest the garden. Harvest vegetables as they ripen instead of waiting for an entire plant to ripen.

Guidelines for Participation – Student Responsibilities

- 1. Students are expected to **actively participate** with planting, maintaining and harvesting the school's garden.
- 2. Students will keep a photo or written plant journal that is updated weekly.
- 3. Students will nurture plants by: a. Watering
- b. Controlling insects and diseases using Integrated Pest Management (IPM) techniques
- c. Weeding
- d. Fertilizing
- e. Harvesting
- f. Recording the harvest
- 4. The **Adult Sponsor** will designate jobs based on nurturing and rotate these responsibilities among students.
- 5. Students will help clean and take care of garden equipment.
- **6. Practice safety and common sense at all times.** a. Remind children to always walk, don't run when gardening.
- b. Teach students to use tools properly.
- c. Always place garden tools face down on the ground when not in use.
- d. Be mindful of hoses as a tripping hazard during watering.
- e. Ensure children are protected from sun damage and insect bites and are properly hydrated when helping.
- f. Remind children to wash hands thoroughly after gardening and to wash vegetables before eating.

Guidelines for Participation - Materials and Support:

LTG program will supply the following items for a **New** bed:

- 1 small tomato cage for peppers
- 1 large tomato cage for tomatoes
- 5-gallon bucket
- 1 fan spray hose nozzle
- 1 small trowel
- 1 cultivator tool
- Various seeds, i.e., lettuce, carrots, beans and cilantro
- Transplants, i.e., tomato and sweet peppers
- Organic granular fertilizer

LTG program will supply the following items each growing season for **Renewals**

- Various seeds, i.e., lettuce, carrots, beans, cauliflower and cilantro
- Transplants, i.e., tomato and sweet peppers
- Organic granular fertilizer

^{*}All other items needed for school garden maintenance must be purchased by school, sponsors or grant money.
