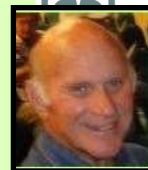

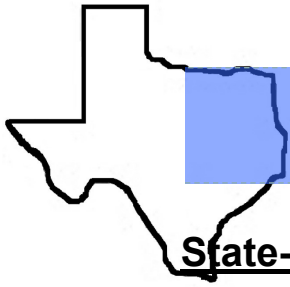

West Oso ISD Summer Bridge Program

Nueces Master Gardeners came out in strength to support the West Oso ISD Summer Bridge Program over two Wednesdays in July. The students were 7th to 12th grade ESL, Economically and Socially Disadvantaged Students who were specifically selected to receive the enrichment outing. None of the students nor the educators had ever visited the sites selected for the two field trips.

On Wednesday, July 21, thirteen students were transported to the Corpus Christi Xeriscape Gardens for an interactive presentation on the principle of design requiring little or no irrigation or other maintenance, used in arid regions. Joan Salge, NMG and Project Coordinator and Vince Muscarello provided handouts, discussion and Q&A for the 45 minute excursion. They then boarded the school bus and headed across town to the 2nd Baptist Church Raised Bed Gardens located off Timbergate and Staples.

They were welcomed there by Daisy Castillo, Community Gardens Coordinator for the Texas A&M AgriLife Program and Vince, who gave a presentation and tour of the gardens answering many questions. The students, educators and bus driver were treated to a fresh vegetable salad bowl with balsamic dressing which none had ever had. The students thought the dressing was chocolate dressing. They were hesitant at first, but quickly went back for seconds. All took extra bowls home with a greater appreciation for fresh vegetables and balsamic dressing thanks to Mary Helen Johnston (1VP) and Jim Johnston.

The 2nd Field Trip was conducted on Wednesday, July 28 at the South Texas Botanical Gardens. Sixteen NMGs and Interns welcomed the students and educators for a multifaceted, interactive tour of the gardens and exhibits. It's not Easy being a Seen Bean. But Iowa Master Gardener and winter Texan, [Marian McNabb](#), has seen lots of Sea Beans and knows about them too!

What is a Sea Bean? Sea Beans are seeds and pods that float into our shores that have grown in other areas. You'll find them in the sand, along the shoreline, and in the litter and sea weed that washes into our shores all along the Gulf Coast.

Three Sea Beans that I've been told are washing up on shore right now, the Heart Bean, the Brain Bean, and Nickernuts.

The Heart Sea Bean, Entada Gigas, is usually plentiful and easy to find. It's Native to the Tropics and grows in a long pod that can be as long as 6 feet, they grow on a vine. There can be as many as 15 or more Heart Beans in a pod.



The Brain Bean, Andira galeottiana, grows on trees in Mexico. Along the Texas Gulf Coast is one of the only areas you'll find it complete. When they travel further they have a tendency to disintegrate due to the distance they travel and the softer outside compared to other Sea Beans. Last winter, 2020/2021 wasn't a good year for them. I think they produce like many trees, producing well every other year.



I've heard there are a lot of Nickernuts, Caesalpinia, this year, we also found a lot last year, 2020/2021. There are 3 different species of Nickernuts that I'm aware of, the Brown Nickernut which is easy to find due to its color.

The Gray Nickernut that seems to blend in with the sand easily, and the Yellow Nickernut. I haven't found a yellow one yet but have found plenty of Brown and Gray ones. They grow on spiny bushes that are Native to the Tropics.

A little about me, I'm a Master Gardener from NW Iowa, in growing zone 4. PeeWee, our dog and I spend our winters in Texas volunteering at Padre Island National Seashore. My husband was retired U.S. Navy, he passed away in 2017 but PeeWee and I still come to Texas, she hunts Tennis Balls while I hunt Sea Beans. I served on the National Board of the National Garden Clubs, for 16 years, am presently serving as Bird and Butterfly Chairman for the Central Region Garden Clubs which consists of 7 States. I love Flowers, Gardening, and hunting Sea Beans along our Gulf Coast in Texas and most anything related to the great outdoors. I call us "All Americans" as we continue to serve our Country as Volunteers.

Sowing Perspective

Getting outdoors grants long-awaited inner peace

LIKE SO MANY Americans, as I've gotten older and with grown and flown children, I've found myself filling my time with more hours of my "day" job. When the pandemic had me stuck at home, I almost never left my desk. It was as if I came to believe that my industry—manacled nouns to verbs—was needed to keep the world ticking on.

Meanwhile, the backyard I worked so hard to tame when I first bought my house was manicured by a crew of strangers and less and less often enjoyed by loved ones. After winter's brutal last blast, I decided it was time to change all of that. I forced myself to put my phone down, turn off the cable news channel and wander outside.

I found the dandelion digger, eschewed gardening gloves and, for two hours, stretched my back, legs and

arms pulling and twisting handfuls of weeds from the beds of drought-resistant natives. I was grateful for the gentle surrender the damp, soft soil afforded. I spoke to the pink buds of my Mexican buckeye and welcomed back the desert willow while whispering words of encouragement to the freeze-traumatized American beautyberry.

I did not curse the agave when it stabbed me, and I took the time to salute the bright yellow dandelion blossoms and profusion of purple buds on the henbit. I apologized that they had to go and acknowledged that in another world or age or garden, they might be the stars. Being assigned the status of weed seems subjective, after all. "Clover," I said, "the luck is not yours today." It offered up no four-leaf rebuttal.

And when my labor was done, I sat in my most seasoned lawn chair and listened to the birds. I tilted my head back and, with my eyes closed, I watched the patterns of clouds dart across my inner eyelids. I heard an ambulance siren in the distance and, without thinking, said the prayer the nuns taught me 50 years ago to say for those in need.

I took deep breaths and sat still for a long time, grateful that I have such a spot in which to gather myself. And I followed that mental garden path to plant seeds of gratitude for lessons learned in this past year, corners turned, memories recovered and priorities reorganized.

Now I am vowing to reap daily the harvest fruits of that day's labor, whether for 10 minutes or an hour of outdoor time on my creaky deck, watering my herbs, learning the names of the birds who visit. Sowing perspective has me harvesting an inner peace that had proved elusive while I labored so long without looking up. ■
