Seed Packet Survey

Please answer these questions on your seed packet paper provided:

1. Name of seeds
2. Cost of seed packet
3. Are the seeds organic?
4. Are these seeds for in-ground planting, container or hydroponic planting?
5. Who is the provider of the seeds? Give information that might be important about which the supply company wants to “brag.
6. Amount of seeds found within the packet
7. Year for production use
8. Days to germinate; Depth to Sow; Seed Spacing; Row Spacing; Days to Harvest
9. Zone for planting
10. Can these seeds be planted continuously?

Paper Towel Gardening

Objective: To create templates divided into representative fractional amounts to ensure that the plants have enough room to grow.

1. Secure paper towel front of you.
2. On your planting cart, found out how many seeds should be placed on the paper towel.
3. How many should be on our paper towel?
4. We will now use the paper towel as our template.
5. On your paper towel, we'll evenly space the correct number of seeds and then glue them to the towel.
6. Divide your towel evenly for the correct number of seeds called for.
7. In the center of the square, place one seed.
8. Let the towel dry.
9. Planting: After the glue dries, we can lay the sheets on the ground in the garden, cover them with a thin layer of soil (note planting depth) and water carefully.

Create Your Own Fall Garden Map

1. Take your 8.5 x 11 inch paper and fold in half.
2. Find any straight edge and draw out your map - squares, rectangles, etc.
3. Choose plants
4. Place number of plants into chosen areas using dots to indicate plants.
5. Estimate production
