### What Being a Master Gardener Means



I'm not sure if all of you know it or not, but I was once a Nacogdoches County Master Gardener myself. I'm pretty sure I'm the only Texas A&M AgriLife horticulturist to ever take the program and teach a part of the program at the same time.

Each year the question comes up: "What is a Master Gardener and what do I have to do to be one?" Because of the title, there is

a perception beyond the program that Master Gardeners are simply highly trained and skilled gardeners. That may be true, but as you know, being a Texas Master Gardener program is much more. It's first and foremost a volunteer program designed to support the outreach of Texas A&M AgriLife.

I'm not sure the Texas Master Gardener program has a mission statement, but I do know that the objectives of the Master Gardener program include: expanding the capabilities of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service to disseminate horticultural information to individuals and groups in the community. And the mission of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service is to provide quality, relevant outreach and continuing educational programs and services to the people of Texas.

So as you see, a Texas Master Gardener's role is to educate and share information, not just to garden. Many of my friends are gardeners, some of them full-time, outstanding gardeners that certainly don't have the time to be a Master

Gardener. I also know many Texas Master Gardeners, including many excellent gardeners. But they, like I do, have to separate their interest, personal goals, and activities in their own home gardens with the job of being a Texas Master Gardener. Like it or not, the Texas Master Gardener program is a team sport. That means putting the goals of the team ahead of our own.

Our job is to teach as many people as possible the proven joys, beauty, and health of gardening. This means putting in at least the minimum volunteer hours required to be a Smith County Master Gardener. Remember, just paying dues doesn't make you a Master Gardener. And of course the entire program wouldn't exist if you didn't document and enter your hours into VMS. Without those numbers, Texas A&M can't justify the program or my support to it.

In class recently, the question came up as to why I wasn't recommending apricots since one of the attendees had some success with them. Never, ever, forgot that our mission as Smith County Master Gardeners is to each others the researched based rules of gardening, not the exceptions. We deal with the masses so we have to teach them concrete methods that the majority can be successful with.

So keep up the good work and keeping adding to your knowledge base so you can help others. Every chance you get, peruse the aggie horticulture website. And if you aren't subscribed to Neil Sperry's e-garden newsletter, please do so. Neil is a good friend and first started as an extension specialist.
