#### About Earth-Kind® Roses

Earth-Kind® is an important designation given to select roses by the Texas A&M University Agriculture program. Earth-Kind® Roses have been through rigorous state-wide testing and evaluation by a team of horticultural experts and found to possess the high level of landscape performance and outstanding disease and insect tolerance/ resistance required for this special designation. Once established, these roses have tremendous heat and drought tolerance.

Earth-Kind® Roses are among the most thoroughly tested and environmentally responsible plants for use in Texas landscapes. These roses do very well in almost any soil type, from the welldrained acid sands of East Texas to the poorly aerated, highly alkaline clavs of Central and Southwest Texas. In most soils, these roses do not need commercial synthetic or organic fertilizers with the correct compost and mulch approach to soil manage-

Earth-Kind® Roses are certainly not immune to pest problems. However, their tolerance to pests is so great that they rarely require the use of chemical pesticides.

#### Choosing Your Earth-Kind® Roses

When deciding which Earth-Kind® Rose you want to plant, there are several things to consider. The most obvious and probably most important to most people would be color. Earth-Kind® Roses come in all shades of whites, pinks, reds, yellows, apricots and some with multiple colors. This is strictly a

personal choice.

Mature size of the rose is also a large deciding factor. Earth-Kind® Roses may be small shrubs barely reaching 3' in mature height, all the way to 10' tall climbing roses.

Fragrance and bloom type may also be used as selection criteria.

Each Earth-Kind® Rose varies in degree of fragrance and whether they are single or double blooming. For more specific information on the different varieties of Earth-Kind® Roses, visit:

### Planting Site:

Just as in real estate, the most important factor in choosing a home for your Earth-Kind® Roses is location, location, location.

First and foremost, the roses need to be planted in locations where they receive direct sunlight for eight hours or more each day.

They need to be in a location with plenty of room. Plant for mature

plant size and leave room for plenty of air circulation. (i.e. do not plant in enclosed areas like courtyards or small backyards which are ringed by 8' fences).

And lastly, they need to be in a location with no overhead irrigation during the evening hours or at night.

#### Bed Preparation:

Roses really respond to well-drained soils. Thus, here are the bed preparation recommendations for the two major soil types:

Sandy and loam soils: Incorporate 3-6 inches of organic matter such as compost.



Fully finished compost.

Clay soils: Incorporate 3 inches of organic matter (e.g. compost) and 3 inches of expanded shale. Plant on raised beds that are at

least 4-6 inches above the surrounding soil.

Don't plant too deep---dig the hole only as deep as the root system is tall....The top of the rootball, once planted, should be at the same level as it was grown in the pot.

#### Maintenance:

Regardless of soil type, Earth-Kind® Roses need to be protected year-round with a layer of organic mulch (e.g. bark mulch from your local landfill, tree leaves) 3-4

inches thick. In addition to its many other benefits, this "living mulch" will act as a super-slowrelease, all-natural fertilizer. In areas of the state plagued by salty irrigation water, it is very important to drip irrigate roses. Salty water applied to the leaves can burn the foliage badly.

Generally referred to as a climber, this selection also has broad use as a ground-cover.

Roses which have received the Earth -Kind® designation do not require regular pruning. If the bushes grow outside their bounds, a light

shaping is all that is necessary. We do recommend that you remove any dead wood as it develops. Research identified all of these Earth-Kind® Roses as self-deadheading (meaning they drop spent blooms on their own), however like all repeat-blooming roses, the bushes will set new buds faster if the spent blooms are removed. Depending on the cultivar, allowing the bushes to self-deadhead adds an additional 1 to 2 weeks to the bloom cycle.

#### Fertilization:

Earth-Kind® Roses planted with the addition of compost and mulched as recommended above do not need additional fertilizer. They will, however, respond well to the application of fertilizers, especially nitrogen.

If this is your choice, fertilize in March, June and lightly in late August. For the March and June

feedings, utilize fertilizers in which at least half of the nitrogen is in the slow release or slowly available form. In late August, apply fertilizers in which the nitrogen is readily available.

Base your selection of fertilizer analysis on the results of a soil test. For assistance in obtaining a soil test kit, contact the Somervell County Extension Office, 254-897-2809.



Blood Meal is an excellent organic source of nitrogen.
